## Wild, Weird & Wonderful World of Orchids

Bill Bergstrom's program promises to be very interesting reflection on some of the strangest and the most stunning flowers in the orchid kingdom. It might change your view of orchids forever. Bill is originally from California. Born in LA, his first job was with the Atomic Energy Commission and later for Douglas Aircraft, ultimately working as an engineer on Space Shuttle Rockets. How did he get to Orchids? Well his chemist brother Douglas was a grower for George Kennedy, a famous orchidophile, collector and writer for Orchid Digest. They became friends, and he too began collecting part time until he found he was making more money selling Orchids than working in the Aerospace industry. As the years went along he spent more time and money collecting Orchids throughout the Americas. At one time he was the preeminent authority on the species *Phragmipedium* and sold the first *Besseas* in the USA at the San Francisco Show in the early 80's. He got out of the collecting business and moved to Hawaii. He now concentrates on rare *Cattleya* species varieties, *Stanhopea*, *Bulbophyllum* and other weird to bizarre species. He is bringing a selection of his plants to sell.

**Became interested in orchids:**

as a child. Mother was a noted horticulturist. When, as a young teen, Tom was ill for several months, an uncle gave him a book on orchids to study – and that hooked him! His great aunt raised orchids, and paid teenaged Tom 25 cents/hour to scrub pots for her plants.

**Grows orchids in:** two growing areas: A warm and a cold one. The warm greenhouse is attached to the south side of the house just off the kitchen; the cold one is a screened porch which he wraps in plastic in the wintertime, on the northwest side of the house.

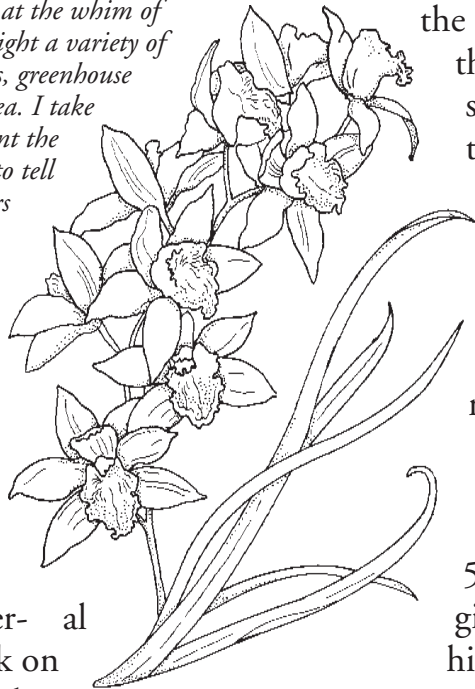
**How many orchid plants:** Has about 600 orchid plants:

**And varieties:** Cattleya and Cattleya alliance (the favorites!) and also any bright-colored odont or cymbidium

**Favorite orchid:** bright red, orange, or yellow cattleyas

**Favorite potting media:** 50% fir bark, 30% perlite, 10% charcoal. Varies size of fir bark for plant and/or root size, also may “throw in” some peat moss for some plants

**Happiest orchid moment:** when a perfect red flower opens. Has two that just came into bloom



as of this writing: an Slc. Jewel Box “Dark Waters”, and an Slc. Vallezac “Evelyn”. (We might see them at the April CAIOS meeting).

**Anything else?** Tom is a founder of the CAIOS, and loves to develop enthusiasm for orchids in others. He supports virtually every display that CAIOS does for other orchid societies by bringing plants, helping design and setting up the display, and doing that all important tear down. Tom loves giving talks on orchids to non-orchid growers, like garden clubs. Think of him for a club you know of.

## May 14th Meeting

May 14th, 2006 meeting is to be held at the Barnstable County Fairground beginning at 1:00 p.m. for the Annual Potting Workshop and the new exciting Division of community pots aka compot.

We will have the general Potting Workshop beginning at 1:00 p.m. for beginners who can bring a few (less than five please) orchids to be repotted. We supply the potting media. Please bring a selection of clean or new pots for your plants since it is difficult to predict what size plants people will bring, though we always bring a few pots. The point is to teach you, not do all of it for you so be prepared to get your hands into it. Please wear warm clothing in layers since we typically try to perform this outside due to mess.

There will be a general business meeting inside to vote on new officers and of course refreshments.

In addition we wanted to entice the more advanced growers to the meeting with the opportunity to divide up community pots of various orchid hybrids and or species. We will be dividing them into individual plantlets and potting them up so you can try to grow them into big blooming plants. We will be trying to obtain some interesting plants and there will likely be a small fee to cover the cost of the potting media and small pots. So all plan on coming to the annual potting Workshop May 14th 2006 - yes it is Mother's Day and no we could not move it to another date due to the fact that the Fairground is booked on all other weekends in May. Normally Kelly's Korner attends but will be unavailable this year due to previous travel arrangements. So we plan on having some bark supplies for sale will up date you in the May Newsletter.
